



meet the author

Theodor Seuss Geisel, better known by his pen name Dr. Seuss, was a writer and cartoonist. The success of The Cat in the Hat cemented Geisel's place in children's literature. His rhymes and characters are beloved by generations of fans.

meet the playwright

Katie Mitchell founded Classics on a Shoestring on the London Fringe in the late 1980s, directing Gorki's Vassa Zheleznova, Arden of Faversham and Euripides' Women of Troy (Gate Theatre, both won Time Out Awards); Live Like Pigs (Royal Court Theatre Upstairs), and The House of Bernarda Alba (Gate Theatre). Katie has been an Associate Director at the Royal Shakespeare Company and the Royal Court Theatre. She is now an Associate Director at The National Theatre. Katie was awarded an OBE in 2009 for services to drama.

Chad Bradford is a multidisciplinary theater artist who worked Off-Broadway and around the country before coming to AMFA as the Associate Director of Children's Theatre and Performing Arts. exploring possibilities

A LETTER FROM DIRECTOR CHAD BRADFORD

When we pause to reflect on our daily lives, we begin to realize how surrounded we are by marvels that we often take for granted. The internet, cars, and even the often unappreciated" Siri" that lives in our phones and watches are technological wonders that, on the surface, seem like they've always been there. I'd like to add to that list the world of Dr. Seuss. His words, images, and influences have become so ingrained in our culture that it's hard to imagine a time when our collective imaginations weren't filled with 'Whos,' 'Grinches,' and 'Green Eggs and Ham.'

Dr. Seuss had a deep love for his work and for the children who enjoyed it. Through his imagination, we meet a Cat eager to rescue two children from the depths of a dull, rainy day—the emotional purgatory of childhood. With his "tricks" and "games," the Cat and his friends show the children that even the simplest things can be transformed through imagination, reminding us that life is full of limitless possibilities if we have the courage to explore them.

As Seuss's career progressed, the character of the Cat reappeared in his art, almost as a stand-in for Seuss himself. In *The Cat in the Hat*, we can see glimpses of Seuss's own mischievous nature as the Cat's love and imagination fill the dull room with life and color.

This same impulse has guided our work as we've prepared this production. We often return to the playwright's words as we search for the next possibility:

"However we dress it up, the impulse to do this show is just an act of love from me to my child." — Katie Mitchell, playwright/adaptor

I hope our production brightens up your own "rainy day" and reminds us that anything is possible—even a Cat in a Hat!—when we Explore Possibilities!



theatre etiquette

ARRIVE EARLY

Arriving 15-30 minutes early allows time to locate your tickets, buy concessions, make a final trip to the restroom, and find your seats.

TURN OFF ELECTRONICS

Lights and sounds from phones and other electronic devices are distracting to other patrons as well as the performers. Photography and videography is not allowed during the performance.

BE AISLE KIND

Say "pardon me" and "thank you" as you move through the aisle; tuck your belongings under our seat to remove tripping hazards; stand up, when possible, to let others move past you when finding their seats. Be sure to take all your belongings with you when you leave and throw away any rubbish on your way out.

PLAY YOUR PART

Watch and listen; laugh at funny bits; applaud at the spectacular. Be present and in the moment with the performers.
